# **OPERATION BEAR HUG**

It was a Wednesday morning, December 24, 2014. The weather outside was rainy and the temperature was in the low 40s. I was in a bed at the hospital after having a procedure done eight days ago. I was waiting for the doctor to make his rounds and release me so I could go home. Disappointment. The doc said they wanted to keep me a couple of days more. The only thing I could think of was that I wouldn't be home for Christmas or my daughter's birthday (also on Christmas Day). What a bummer.

That evening after dinner, as I lay there watching TV and feeling down in the dumps, a knock came on my door. I said, "Come in." A girl about 16 entered my room and said she was from the Haddonfield United Methodist Church. I knew right away what she had for me. When my children were in the youth group at church (HUMC), my wife and I would take them to hospitals on Christmas Eve to deliver "BEARS." And we kept doing that for a couple of more years even after they were out of the group.

I did not recognize her but told her I was a member of the church. That changed my whole attitude and brought me out of my depression. I was like a kid again receiving my favorite toy. Just a little bear can make your day a wonderful day. If you come to visit me, and as you go from the dining area into the kitchen, my bear (now 8 years old) will be looking at you.

Thank you to all who participated in Operation Bear Hug 2022! Over 490 bears were collected and delivered to local hospitals for delivery to those staying in the hospital on Christmas Eve.

Most needed donations include nonperishable food items. pancake mix, pancake syrup, laundry detergent, deodorant, bar soap, shampoo, and napkins.

# **A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR**

# "God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them." - 1 John 4:16



It is hard to believe that we are entering into the year 2023, but I have to say, I do so with a grateful

heart. Of course, I am grateful for the blessings in my life: for my family and for this church family. I am especially grateful to have survived the most acute phase of the pandemic, which lasted two years. In that time we lost many loved ones, and in many ways our lives and world were reshaped. What better time to think about a brand new year ahead and to renew our relationship with God.

The early Methodists of the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century celebrated New Year's Day by renewing their covenant to serve God and neighbor. New Year's Day would be a time of covenant renewal, with prayers and the preaching of the word that would help people recommit their lives to

From this tradition, the following prayer emerged over the years called the Wesley Covenant Prayer. Although it is attributed to John Wesley, it is likely not written by him, but captures the spirit of the Wesleyan tradition of recommitment and to covenanting with God as a way to begin the new year:

I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious
