When it comes to the sacrament of baptism, many traditions in Christianity typically take an "either/or" approach, with some congregations only baptizing babies, while others will only perform the sacrament for adults. With the church that I grew up in, I was baptized at around 8 or 9 years of age, which was pretty much the youngest they would allow.

I remember wading into waistdeep water in an oblong-shaped hot tub, with water that was anything but hot. I remember standing there for a few minutes while a testimony that I had prerecorded was played back over the speakers. I can't recall exactly what I said, but I think it was very saccharine, innocent, and (if I'm honest) cringey.

Forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead - Philippians 3:13

But I'm also grateful for the fact that I can remember my baptism. Every baptism that we observe here at HUMC reminds me of the earnest, childlike faith that was a feature of my baptism. Whether one gets baptized as an infant, child, or adult, the occasion is an opportunity for us to remember our declaration of faith and being welcomed into a community of believers.


Give Up Plastic For Lent with the Green Team

A new year, a new start. Of course there is the well-worn tradition of New Year's resolutions, but more than any resolution.

or promise to ourselves, I think we need a reset this year.

Think about it. When our electronic devices malfunction. or misbehave, the most effective solution is to reset them. Sometimes after I get through a busy or challenging time, I find that I need a reset, too.

A reset of the heart and mind can help us let go of regrets, stress, and bad habits from the previous season to make way for what lies ahead.

As the Apostle Paul reminded the church in Philippi in Philippians 3:13-15, pressing forward, being present to new opportunities, and allowing God to use us for God's purposes requires a letting go of the past.

But how do we do it - how can we find a reset?

In 1755 the first Methodist societies began a new tradition of meeting at a French Church in Spitalfields,

London, to recommit themselves to God and reset their priorities for the new year. With 1,800 people at the first observance, this annual tradition would come to be observed on the first Sunday of the new year as a way to recommit to a life of Christian discipleship, seeking to let go of the past and to be open to serve God and neighbor for the year to come.

The Wesleyan Covenant Prayer is a prayer that is the best-known component of the Covenant Renewal services (see box, right):

This year we will observe our own Covenant Renewal Service on January 7 and begin a sermon series, "Reset." I invite you not only to take part in this service, but to pray this prayer on your own. Start your day with it, and see how over time it can help reset your priorities and open up within you a space to let go of what lies behind to embrace what God has in store for us in a new year.

As we begin 2024 together, remember: God is present. God is good. God loves us. God is doing a new thing. God can work through us. We are called to love God and to love our neighbor above all.

Trusting that love is the more excellent way will carry us through any difficulty we may face and provide us the grace and blessings we need.

I'm ready for a "Reset." Join me as we walk boldly and lovingly into this new season together.
