HIGHLIGHTS A SEASON OF REVIVAL AND CELEBRATION

The festive season began with a truly spectacular Christmas Eve. Over 700 people joined our live-streamed services, and 1200 attended in-person, marking the best-attended Christmas Eve since the pandemic's onset.

On Martin Luther King, Jr., Day, our intergenerational team served the North Camden community, cleaning and composting at Neighborhood Collaborative Community Gardens. Meeting NJ First Lady Tammy Murphy was a highlight for the team. The day concluded with lunch and a presentation on preserving Black Haddonfield by Craig Hutchings.

Our spirits soared during the Revival in the Methodist Spirit on January 27, featuring Rev. Rachel Billups, Lan Wilson, and special testimonies. Rev. Billups continued to inspire us the following day during worship.

On February 11, we celebrated music and worship arts. The 10:30am Traditional service featured the Holtz Handbell Choir, special readings, anthems, and remarkable musical performances, showcasing the rich talents within our church family.



NJ MASTERCHORALE SPRING CONCERT

New Jersey MasterChorale will present a concert, *Reconciliation*, centered around *Dona Nobis Pacem* by Ralph Vaughan Williams, and *The Cry of Jeremiah* by contemporary composer Rosephanye Powell, accompanied by organ, winds, strings, brass, and percussion on Sunday, May 5.

Dona Nobis Pacem (Grant Us Peace) is a timeless anti-war work with text taken from the Latin mass, the Bible, poetry of Walt Whitman (written just after the American Civil War), and even part of a 19th century political speech. It was inspired by Vaughan Williams' time serving as a medic in World War I and was completed just before the outbreak of the Second World War.

The Cry of Jeremiah deals with the prophet's internal conflict and eventual acceptance of God's guidance and authority. Powell's writing is influenced by many styles from chant to Handel to contemporary gospel.

Drawing on his 18-year ministry at the New Room, David will help us retrace the steps of John Wesley in Bristol, England, sharing images, writings, and stories from its vast archives, the very first Methodist preaching house in the world, dating from 1739.

It was this ministry outpost that gave birth to the Methodist movement that took root across England, came over to America, and spread around the world. In exploring the roots of the Methodist movement, we can reclaim the spirit of Methodism that spread through field preaching, serving the poor, fighting to end slavery, and spread good news to all people around the globe. David's unique and powerful way of retelling history will help us to see the present challenges and opportunities with a new perspective.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

"As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience." - Colossians 3:12



The first Sunday of Lent I shared the story of how, almost 20 years ago, I kicked the habit of drinking

soda by swapping one less-thanhealthy habit with a healthier one.

Over the rest of Lent, I sought to focus on integrating just a couple small keystone habits back into my life to see if they could become a regular part of my rhythm. So far, my prayer habit and physical exercise habit have not only stuck, but they have begun to yield other good habits as well.

At this stage of my life, I am seeking to integrate more disciplines into my daily routines, as I grow keenly aware that health, family, and prosperity should never be taken for granted.

One of the essential elements of

Methodist theology, as taught by founder, John Wesley, is the call of Christian perfection. In Wesley's understanding, we are not, and will never be, perfect in this life, but we are called to strive to do better, be better, and to love others more perfectly each day.

In order to grow in how we love God and one another, we root ourselves in different disciplines, such as prayer, serving others, working toward justice and peace, and other faithful disciplines.

For much of my life I gave up too easily on disciplines out of a fear of failure. Yet, I more gratefully appreciate Wesley's teaching today that we are to strive forward, knowing we cannot be perfect, but trusting that God will perfect us and help us to grow through God's perfect love.

"Absolute perfection belongs not to man, nor to angels, but to God alone. As one instance of this, be always ready to own any fault you have been in. If you have at any time thought, spoken, or acted wrong, be not backward to acknowledge it. Never dream that this will hurt the cause of God; no, it will further it." – John Wesley in his sermon, "A Plain Account of Christian Perfection."

How will you strive further today to love God and root your life in faithful disciplines so that you might bear more fruits of faith?

Know that along the way, as you stumble, which we all do, forgiveness and restoration are a part of our shared life together.
