

We are currently 24.4% of the way to meeting our 2023 goal of 6,500 items collected.

Continue to drop off nonperishable items in the breezeway of the church, located next to the parking lot anytime! Most needed donations include non-perishable, pancake mix. pancake syrup. laundry detergent, toilet tissue, and napkins.

Haddonfield UMC has several active circles, meeting monthly. Our United Women in Faith also have regular luncheons with guest speakers and run service projects supporting our mission partners. Every September, they host the Thrifty Treasures Rummage Sale with proceeds benefiting mission work.

much younger they looked just seven months ago. In one school year, they have grown taller, matured, and have grown in their academics, social relationships, and even church participation. A lot can happen in one year!

The same goes for the program year in the life of the church – so much can happen and change. Thinking back to September, we really didn't know what to expect for our ministries in the first year without mask restrictions since the start of the pandemic.

This May/June I want to celebrate what God has done in the life of Haddonfield UMC over the past program year. We have emerged from prolonged uncertainty into

a vibrant new season where we are experiencing blessings and opportunities at every turn.

Just like looking at children's photos side by side in September and June, we can see the growth and development of our church thriving in the present and embracing the future.

Among the things we celebrate together this year:

- .57% growth in children's Sunday programming attendance
- ·30 new members
- ·46% increase in Trunk or Treat attendance
- ·110.5% increase in Advent Workshop attendance
- ·Doubling of attendance of our NJ MasterChorale concerts
- ·724 in-person Easter attendance with over 489 online (total over 1,200 in 2023, compared to 1,000 in-person attendance Easter
- ·Increase in preschool

enrollment with addition of full day kindergarten next year

Along with quantifiable successes. we have launched a new strategic plan that will help us build on this year's growth to more fully live into our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. The three goals of this plan that will set the tone for our ministry efforts are:

- ·Ignite Passionate Faith
- ·Build Up the Next Generation of Faithful Leaders
- ·Respond to the Hurts and Needs Around Us
