SPOTLIGHT: Vital Connection in Small Groups

Connections are vital. The neural network in our body drives our physical movements, how we process stimuli, and our emotions. A personal network is another form of connection. It can help make a large and thriving community like HUMC feel smaller for those of us who want to bridge personal connections with others in the church.

Last fall HUMC started small Grace Groups, a gathering of five to seven individuals who meet regularly to discuss life since their last get together: how their faith journey has been; what God sightings they experienced; what challenges they would like to offer to God.

The conversations have evolved into deeper discussions. Participants share their joys and struggles in their work and personal lives. They have developed bonds with each other. The small church group has become an embedded part of their routines to help them get through the week.

There is also a light component to these groups, too. Participants have recommended to each other books, BritBox and Netflix series, and songs to help distract them from the daily grind.

SPRING EVENTS EMPHASIZE THE HOPE OF THE SEASON

David Worthington Presentation On March 13, David Worthington, Director of Global Relations at John Wesley's New Room in Bristol, England, delivered an indepth presentation on the history of the Methodist Movement. This event, held in Fellowship Hall, was attended by about 100 people in-

person and over 150 online.

Easter Egg Hunt & Spring Fair The Easter Egg Hunt & Spring Fair, held on March 30, brought the HUMC parking lot to life, with about 400 children enjoying springtime festivities. The event not only offered fun activities like egg hunts but also supported mission partners like the Cherry Hill Food Pantry and the Neighborhood Center.

Easter Celebrations

We celebrated Easter, on March 31. with over 900 attendees across five services and 435 online participants, celebrating Jesus' resurrection and the hopeful spirit of the season.

Stephen Minister Commissioning

On April 14, three new Stephen Ministers—Elaine Del Rossi, Richard Edwards, and Jeanne Page-Soncrant were commissioned during the 10:30am Traditional Worship service. In addition, all of our Stephen Ministers were recognized, celebrating the vital role they have in supporting individuals navigating challenging life seasons.

RECONCILIATION

On **Sunday, May 5** at 7pm, the New Jersey MasterChorale presents "Reconciliation," a concert featuring works that resonate with the pursuit of peace amidst contemporary challenges. The program includes Ralph Vaughn Williams' "Dona Nobis Pacem" and "Cry of Jeremiah" by Rosephanye Powell.

Vaughn Williams' piece, born from his World War I experiences, draws from Walt Whitman's poetry and Old Testament prophets' words, urging for peace. Powell's composition intertwines Jeremiah's plea for deliverance with African American musical traditions, symbolizing shared experiences of suffering and hope. "Reconciliation" signifies not only unity among diverse peoples but also the eternal quest for peace.

The NJ MasterChorale will be joined by members of the Philadelphia Orchestra and friends and soloists Cherisse Bonefont, Jason Buckwalter, and Kimberly Christie. Tickets are free at haddonfieldumc.org/ ni-masterchorale.


Six Flags Youth Trip

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

"...give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." – 1 Thessalonians 5:18



They say that you should always count your blessings, but have you ever done it literally? I

find that it is easy to go from busy season to busy season without celebrating the good things or processing the transitions. Too often we go from one set of activities to the next, one season of change to the next, often focusing on what we want to happen or want to get but not enough taking stock of what God has done or is doing in the present.

So, I would like you to grab a pen and take a minute, either in the margin of this newsletter, on a separate piece of paper, or maybe in your phone, and count your blessings: list the highlights of this past year in which you have experienced goodness, have enjoyed success, have experienced connection with friends or family, or even list the simple blessings of nature, health,

or life itself.

In our worst seasons, we can be convinced that our blessings are few, but if we take the time, our perspective can open up to find blessing in each breath, each moment, and, as Scripture says, each morning.

In this spirit I want to count some of the blessings at HUMC over this past year: we returned to a full and flourishing program life after several years of limited participation or offerings. We planted five new small groups, welcomed 49 new members, and saw exponential growth in our Sunday School classes. We saw significant growth to our support of mission, mission projects, and mission partnerships, and set new records for our community attendance at our Trunk or Treat and Easter Egg Hunt events. We welcomed Rev. Rachel Billups to preach an incredible revival in January and hosted David Worthington, from the New Room in Bristol in March. both with amazing support from our

community. At the same time, we experienced growth with our Steeple Club, Wednesday Night Dinners, Floral Arts Guild, and New Jersey MasterChorale. Including both virtual and inperson numbers, our weekly worship attendance is over 200 more people a week than it was in 2019. How's that for counting your blessings?

Beyond mere numeric growth, I have heard awesome first person stories from members, both new and old, of how their participation in our ministries has impacted their lives and deepened their relationships with God and others. Thank you for being a part of the blessings! I am grateful for this congregation, for renewed spirit, and for what God is doing, even in difficult seasons, to offer hope in a hurting world. I pray your own list can give you a sense of gratitude and joy this day.
