A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

"For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance..." - Matt. 25:29a



Earn, save, give all you can.

As fall draws to a close, November and December usher in a period of

both gratitude and extravagance. At the end of November, we gather together with families to celebrate Thanksgiving, and hopefully express some sense of gratefulness for all the gifts in our lives. And the very next day we go into full-on spend mode with Black Friday, Cyber Monday, and Giving Tuesday.

For the next month, we buy gifts, spend money on decorations, throw parties, eat too much food, and rack up credit card debt. The deeper I've been going into my doctoral studies in some of the early writings of Methodism's founder John Wesley, I am taken by his emphasis on stewardship as being central to the Christian life.

For Wesley, gratitude towards God, for God's unconditional love and forgiveness in our lives, calls us to take account for everything entrusted to us, and to be good stewards of our time, money, relationships, and resources. In Wesley's sermon "The Use of Money," he gives us the well-worn saying: "Earn all you can, save all you can, and give all you can."

But what strikes me about the sermon is that he goes into depth that earning all we can is a spiritual mandate that we shouldn't waste our talents, skill sets, or passions. We should use everything we have to make an impact in this world. However, he is clear that earning all we can should be done as an expression of love, meaning we should only do so as long as it does not harm our body, mind, or spirit, and does not harm our neighbor physically, spiritually, or mentally. Wesley is clear that everything we should do is an extension of loving God and loving our neighbor.

Wesley's second point of saving gives us a fundamental spiritual principle of thrift and modesty. I often fall short in this, as I love to buy things I don't need and fall prey to marketing attempts aimed at my interest in technology, guitars, and books. Wesley reminds us that what we have been entrusted with is a resource to use in love of God and love of neighbor.

This takes us to his third point, to give all we can. Every dollar, minute, or friendship we have is a gift to be spent for the purpose of communicating love. That could be done through helping those in need, through building up institutions and ministries that offer hope to people, and in other ways that make a positive impact in the world. This season of gratitude and extravagance, I am reminded of the call to earn, save, and give all that we can, for the sake of loving God and loving our neighbor as our self as Jesus commands us.
