In August, our youth group traveled to Give Kids the World Village (GKTW), a partner organization of the Make-a-Wish Foundation. Families with children diagnosed with a terminal or lifechanging illness are invited to stay, fulfilling their wish to visit a theme park in Orlando, Florida. Gathered in the Village are families facing unimaginable challenges met by volunteers from all walks of life.

This year I volunteered at the Christmas party. At GKTW, yearly holidays are celebrated on a weekly basis. Some families may not have been able to celebrate last year because of a hospital stay or a child being too sick; some may not have the chance to celebrate in the future. On this night, the atmosphere was filled with music, dancing, games, and the smiles of children eagerly waiting to sit on Santa's lap.

During the party I met Dan, whose condition prevents him from speaking. Through the use of his iPad, Dan shared his upcoming plans and some favorite memories. His smile radiated across the room, sharing his past travels, people he's met, and his upcoming trip across the East Coast.

In a place filled with families facing life's hardest challenges, the light of Christ shined bright. Joy, hope, and healing abounded as families made memories and connected with each other.

While our world is broken, GKTW is a testament to Christ's presence in all of creation. I find my faith renewed that one day we may be saved from the ailments of our world. I bear the Good News: the Kingdom of heaven is upon us. Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

"Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus..." - Philippians 2:5



As the new school year begins, I am excited to start a new program year here at HUMC! Our theme this year is "Revive Us Again"

with a focus on revival: leaning into the movement of God's spirit to stir within our congregation a new and exciting chapter of faithfulness, discipleship, and service.

As a part of our revival theme. I have decided to use different excerpts from the writings of John Wesley, founder of the Methodist movement to inspire, and at times challenge us, to be committed followers of Jesus Christ, guided by the Holy Spirit.

The first text I want to reflect upon comes from one of John's earliest attempts to describe who and what the Methodists were in a letter called "A Plain Account of the People Called Methodist."

"First, that orthodoxy, or right opinions, is, at best, but a very Ghost.'"

Wesley points out that true religion is not necessarily about an adherence to right belief alone, but rather, having the mind of Christ work in the heart to the point in which we produce the fruits of the Spirit. I love this entire letter because the downfall of many churches is that we have difficulty living in peace with one another when we expect complete conformity of thought instead of unity of heart.

The Methodist movement was built on loving God and loving others in community even in the midst of difference. This shared commitment of reflecting God's love changed hearts and
