### **A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR** "Is your heart as true to mine as mine is to yours?' Jehonadab answered, 'It is.' Jehu said, 'If it

### is, give me your hand." - 2 Kings 10:15

One of my many sidelined plans for 2020 included participating in a Methodist heritage pilgrimage to England. By March, I had signed up for, made a deposit on, and begun to get excited about finally getting to visit not only the country of England but several key places that I have read, studied, preached, and learned about through my career as a Methodist pastor. Some of the places would include Aldersgate Street, where John Wesley had his conversion experience that gave the Methodist movement its spirit power, and Epworth, where the rectory was located that burned down with John Wesley still inside when he was a boy.

Another site to be visited on this trip was Oxford, where students John and Charles started the Holiness Club, which was really a small group where these pastors-in-training would live out their faith life in relationship with one another. The trip would conclude with visiting

Wesley Chapel in London, John's final home and primary pulpit by the end of his life.

Now, two years later, Pastor JiSun and I are finally going on this pilgrimage in July. I am excited about taking this pilgrimage, not just because we will get to travel and visit new places, but because of the parallels I see between the climate of the world in 18<sup>th</sup> century England and today, as well as the parallel between the power of the early Methodist movement and the need for such a spiritual revival now. When the Methodist movement was born, there was political turmoil with disputes over who was the rightful heir to throne of the King of England with different parties and factions embattled against one another. England was plaqued with the injustices of slavery, child labor, unlivable conditions for the impoverished, and other social ills.
