

EASTER EGG HUNT & SPRING FAIR AND EASTER WORSHIP

Many thanks to all who attended or otherwise participated in this year's Easter Egg Hunt and Spring Fair on Saturday, April 16! We hosted around 250 children for egg hunts (including sensoryfriendly hunts), games, facepainting, and food. Members of UrbanPromise, the Floral Arts Guild, the Disabilities Task Force, Connect Groups, the Hospitality Team, and the child care team all lent a hand to make the day special. As part of the event's mission focus, 169 food items were collected for the Cherry Hill Food Pantry.

Our Easter weekend worship this year included six services with offerings including inperson, online only, and livestreams of in-person worship. Over 900 people attended either

in-person or online to celebrate Christ's resurrection. Half of our Easter Offering benefitted humanitarian response efforts in Ukraine, administered by UMCOR (the United Methodist Committee on Relief).
