"...just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in the newness of life." — Romans 6:4

If you would have told me two years ago that I would spend 12 months building out a video ministry within the church, creating a video studio, organizing an active digital ministries team, building a new backdrop to our stage, and garnering 400 online views to worship each week, I would have been thrilled. However, if you would have added that we wouldn't be meeting in-person, I would be home-schooling my kids, and I wouldn't see any friends, family, or most church members within that same year, I would have been kicking and screaming.

Even when some things go our way, when we are not in control of our lives, it can feel like death and plunge us into despair. The lack of control and compounded grief of this past year from fear, death of many people around us, and the loss of normal rhythms of life as well as face-to-face gatherings has felt like death to so many of us. And yet, as Christians, we use as our primary symbol a wooden structure that represents death. The cross was a weapon of death used by the Roman Empire against dissidents and criminals. As believers in the risen Christ, we know that God overturns death and makes something beautiful out of the ashes. The rhythm of our Christian year is birth in the cold and darkness of winter, and we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus in the spring to remind us of God's natural rhythm.

As spring bursts forth, we are beginning to see new signs of hope and resurrection around us. As vaccination numbers are on the rise and COVID cases and related deaths are falling, we are beginning to resume some of the rhythms of our life. In our church we are cautiously and carefully resuming in-person worship, small groups, and other ministries, knowing that it will take some time until things are back to "normal." However, the real point of Easter is that beyond the death of something is not the return to what it used to be. Resurrection is always the birth of something new. The resurrected Christ was different from Jesus the teacher. The resurrected Christ put the onus of living out and sharing the good news onto the disciples, giving birth to the church.

As we slowly emerge from this pandemic, I know that what we want the most is to go back to normal, but we will quickly find that life is different. Work will be different, and church will be different. In this season of resurrection, God calls us more than ever to come together and offer of ourselves to strengthen and share our love for God and to join together with the whole congregation so that we can truly be the church of Jesus Christ in the midst of a hurting world. Join with me in prayer for revival for our congregation and for an emboldened witness to the world of the resurrection power of God's Spirit working in our lives. He is risen, he is risen indeed!

# SHARE YOUR STORY

#### **CONNECTION DURING A PANDEMIC** by Karen Becker



I remember driving to church in late February last year after hearing that a new virus in Wuhan, China, was threatening to spread. I stopped at CVS on the way to buy hand sanitizer, just in case. It seemed odd that they were out, so I proceeded to Rite Aid. When they were also out of stock, I called my husband and asked him to check another CVS and Walgreens that I hadn't gone to. He came to church with one sticky, mangled, travel-sized bottle that he'd pulled from the very back of a shelf. It's so strange to think that was our first inkling something big might be headed our way.

As it turns out, HUMC was the last public place I set foot in before the world went on lockdown. At first, attending worship with so many people chatting on the Facebook live-stream was a novelty. As the weeks wore on, it became both the norm and the highlight of otherwise monotonous weeks of isolation. Because of a chronic illness, I have remained mostly at home since March of last year. It

is a cherished part of my week to sit in our living room with my husband, enjoying our coffee during worship while our boys are still asleep. I have not missed the chaos of getting a family of four out the door by 8:30am every Sunday! And while I have always enjoyed our Mom's Group meetings, I cannot imagine the last year without that time each week with these fiercely faithful women who have weathered the worry and fear and struggle of the last year together. Our group is probably stronger now than ever. While we wait to gather again in-person, I give daily thanks that HUMC wasted no time in creating meaningful ways to stay connected during the pandemic.
