I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you. — Philippians 1:3-4

As I read Paul's letter to the church in Philippi, I realize that I share his exact sentiment. I am deeply grateful for each of you when I think of our connection even though it is not in person. That verse has caused me to reflect upon the early church in which Paul was an evangelist. At that time, early Christians were in the minority of their societies and were spread out, scattered throughout Europe, the Near East, and Asia. Most Christian churches would never meet each other and were quite isolated. Yet they remained connected through three important ways: prayer, letter writing, and traveling evangelists. It was by sending letters by couriers that Christians remained connected and encouraged. You could say the connection among Christians of the first and second centuries was primarily a virtual connection - not unlike today, where we are relying on distant communication to keep our hearts and spirits joined together in God's love.

We are quickly coming up on the one-year anniversary of a statewide shelter-in-place order in New Jersey that disrupted every aspect of our lives and made normal occurrences in our lives not possible or at least unsafe. And yet, in it all, God is good! God continues to be at work in the world and in our lives, even when we don't understand it and can't see it. We are not alone and all is not lost. Hope springs eternal.

On Wednesday, February 17, we celebrate Ash Wednesday, beginning the six week season of Lent, taking us to Easter on April 4. Just as Lent takes us on a journey from acknowledging our own human limitations and mortality to the hope and promise of resurrection, it also coincides with the persistent march of nature from winter into spring. We move from long nights

into longer days, from cold into warmth, and from the isolation of indoors to the freedom and beauty of getting outside. This reflects the same march of hope that our faith leads us on as we move from a long year of loss and isolation to a reality ahead when we can once again be together in person to exchange handshakes and to share hugs.

In the meantime, God is working in our church through renewed means and even new traditions to keep us connected with each other, to grow in our discipleship, and to serve others in the name of Jesus Christ.

In the pages of this newsletter, please find information about our Lenten themes and offerings and about how to engage and serve through our ministries while still connected virtually.

I miss seeing you, but I am grateful to remain connected in spirit,

LENTEN WORSHIP FOCUSES ON SPIRITUAL PRACTICES

Lent begins Wednesday, February 17 or Ash Wednesday! As we prepare our minds and hearts for the Easter miracle, Lent provides the opportunity to find new or re-engage with spiritual practices. Our Lenten series, *Purple Theory: A Lenten Series on Spiritual Disciplines*, takes a look at a different spiritual practice each week through sermons and other supporting resources. Developed by the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference program, Breakthrough, we will explore:

- Prayer February 21
- **Scripture** February 28
- Fasting March 7
- Confession March 14
- Worship March 21
- Silence March 28 (Palm Sunday)
- Gratitude April 4 (Easter Sunday)

Join us for a live virtual Service of Ashes on Wednesday, February 17 at 7pm! This special service will be available through the <u>Haddonfield UMC app</u>, <u>haddonfieldumc.org</u>, and <u>Facebook Live</u> and an audio-only service will be available by calling 856-213-2015. The service will feature music, scripture, and a reflection on the spiritual practice of "Self-Examination." Ashes will be available for pick up in the breezeway of the church adjacent to the parking lot for a week prior to the service. WORSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

EXPANDED VIRTUAL WORSHIP OPTIONS

Over the course of 2020, we expanded capabilities for virtual worship! Both the 9am Contemporary service and the 10:30am Traditional service are available through the church website, the church mobile app, and Facebook Live.

Almost 400 people on average worship together across the two services on Sunday mornings, and we average over 800 people worshiping each week as people experience worship at different times (this includes the people worshiping together on Sunday mornings). To bring the experience of worship to more people and foster a better connection, we have added:

- Phone-Livestreaming Experience an audio-only worship feed by calling 856-213-2015 at scheduled worship times. The system allows you to enable live notifications, so you receive a phone call each time we are live (averages two calls per week not including special services and events). A small number of archived services are available on-demand by calling the same number.
- Church Online Platform This platform, available through the <u>church</u> <u>website</u>, enables us to participate in community during worship live-streams through a chat feature. The chat opens Sundays at 8:50am for Contemporary worship and 10:15am for Traditional worship and remains open briefly after services. Make sure to say hello or request prayer with one of the hosts!
- YouTube Archives Sunday worship services are uploaded to YouTube
 on Sunday afternoons, so you can worship any time that is convenient.

VIRTUAL CONCERTS DRAW LARGER NUMBERS



Members of our music ministry and staff put together two virtual concerts last fall. The Mi Wha Lee Memorial Sanctuary Organ Concert, presented on November 14, featured organist Matt Smith playing a selection of pieces. Around 185 people viewed the concert live and over 800 people have tuned in total. A Christmas concert on December 13, featuring archival footage and newly recorded selections, included two virtual

choir pieces and was directed by Harriet and Wayne Richmond. Over 500 people watched live and over 1,900 have viewed the concert. MUSIC PROGRAMS EXPLORE VIRTUAL OUTLETS



Members of our choirs and worship team continue to provide music for our worship services, either at recording sessions or by participating in virtual choirs or ensembles. Organist Matt Smith has produced ten virtual choir pieces for Traditional worship, involving 30 people, and he has coordinated hymns and special music pieces for Traditional worship which

include members of Chancel Choir and New Jersey MasterChorale. Six musicians participated in our live Christmas Eve service, and the Chancel Choir holds a weekly Zoom session. Jessica Thomas, Director of Contemporary Worship, includes a steady rotation of Worship Team members for Contemporary music and has also produced special music pieces that incorporate creative arrangements and ensembles.

CHILDREN'S CHOIRS REHEARSING NOW



Does your child enjoy singing and performing? Children ages 4-12 can participate in two choirs, Cherub Choir (age 4-1st grade) and Joyful Hearts (2nd - 6th grade). Your child can learn early vocal training and basic music fundamentals in a loving and accepting environment. Our choirs perform regularly during worship services. Rehearsals are currently held

FOOD COLLECTION HAS LARGE OUTPOURING OF SUPPORT

MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS

MASK TO MASK PROGRAM DONATES FUNDS TO LOCAL HOSPITALS

When cloth face masks were hard to come by last year, a group of volunteers joined together to provide masks for the community. With a suggested donation of \$10 per mask, this initiative raised over \$2300 in funds, which were donated to three local hospitals to help provide personal protective equipment (PPE) to staff.

MISSION CONTINUES WORK DESPITE PANDEMIC



We continue to support our partners in Los Cocos, Dominican Republic, with financial relief for food and supplies and by sending cloth face masks to the community. This year, while unable to send a mission team to Los Cocos to build houses, we are providing funds raised in November for the completion of two new homes with work done by the members of the local

community. It may look different, but our work and partnership continues!

CONNECT IN MEANINGFUL RELATIONSHIPS

CHILDREN'S AND FAMILY MINISTRIES PROGRAM PAVES NEW PATH



Last year brought new opportunities for our Children's and Family program. We launched four Sunday School classes on Zoom and offer weekly video Children's Messages that include science experiments that tie-in to our virtual worship services! In the fall, we hosted three outdoor events: Family Yoga, Family Movie Night, and Pumpkin Painting, with over 150 people in attendance! During Advent, families used take-home Advent Wreath Kits to

build their own Advent Wreaths, and we offered a special virtual class where children heard the story of the Wise Men and learned about the science behind our night sky. On Christmas Eve, we hosted a virtual children's service that included filmed segments of our church families! We look forward to being in ministry with our families in 2021. SMALL GROUPS PROVIDE CONNECTION

Small groups are just one of the ways we connect in meaningful relationships. Right now, many small groups are meeting over Zoom and are providing ongoing means of connection.

- Faithful Family Group Parents can connect in conversation and fellowship for the purpose of supporting each other in raising and nurturing children in Christian faith.
- **Spiritual Practices** Pastor JiSun leads Lectio Divina, a means of studying sacred scripture, and Pastor Chris leads a Centering Prayer that focuses on prayer requests, readings, and silent and spoken prayer.
- **Study Groups** Our Bible Study groups, Koinonia, and Christian RoundTable groups continue to meet.
