
United Women in Faith Luncheon

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

"Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." - Matthew 19:14



I hope you have had a fun and blessed summer! One of the most meaningful parts of my summer was traveling to

Great Britain with Pastor JiSun to learn more about the deep roots of Methodism during a Wesleyan pilgrimage.

Traveling internationally is something that feels both natural and exciting to me after nine pilgrimages and 25 international trips for work and personal travel. It felt good to get back on a plane and fly across the Atlantic. In many ways this trip made life seem normal again, like things used to be before the pandemic; however, there were constant reminders that things are different. Travel has changed – life has changed.

I experienced this in the airport with the absence of long lines, evidence of the global labor shortage, and the appearance of iPads everywhere, with almost no people present and just screens and iPad terminals to do things like order food. I realized that technology has taken over everywhere and has changed the way people pay, travel, order, register, and communicate.

Life is quickly normalizing, but it is not the normal of 2019. That is absolutely the same for the Church. This fall we are excited for a new year of programming, sermon series, choir concerts, children's events, and mission opportunities, and yet attendance patterns, how we participate, and even the people who are present has been shaped by the pandemic experience. God calls us to adapt, to be faithful, and to follow Jesus.

Like the world around us, the Church is forever changed. We know people worship with us from around the world at different times, and that is okay. We know people are part of small groups, attending from home offices on Zoom, and that is okay. We know people move away and remain an active part of our congregation, and that is more than okay. We pray that is the new way of being the Church through technological means.

I am excited for plans in the coming year to:

- Ignite passionate faith
 Build up the next generation
 of faithful leaders
- 3. Respond to the hurts and needs around us through mission and service

I hope to see you in person this fall, but I strongly encourage you to invest in your faith development and help us to continue to be the church of Jesus Christ in a world that needs light, love, and hope in the way that works best for you.
